Memorial to Jaffe Will Be Broadcast

"Jewish Video Cleveland" on Nov. 12 and Nov. 14 on Viacom's cable TV channel 27 will feature the dedication of a synagogue outside Jerusalem in memory of Clevelander Arthur Jaffe, who died tragically before he could realize his dream of making aliyah.

The segment is part of the one-hour "Hello Jerusalem" video magazine broadcast by the Jewish Community Federation in the "Jewish Video Cleveland" time slot each Monday and Wednesday evening at 7:30 p.m.

In addition, "Hello Jerusalem" includes an in-depth look at the beginnings of Tel Aviv and its bustling life today; a lively ballad by the Tzavta Club in Tel Aviv; an interview with Tel Aviv architect Avraham Yaski and

observations of the work of sculptor Danny Caravan.

In regular segments, former Israel Ambassador to the United States Simcha Dinitz interviews Tel Aviv Mayor Shlomo Lahat and three leading high-tech industrialists, while Walter Zanger takes viewers to the ancient hot baths of Tiberius.

"Hello Jerusalem" is part of a three-hour program package aired by National Jewish Television via satellite each Sunday from 1 to 4 p.m., also on Viacom's channel 27. Each week, the Monday and Wednesday evening broadcasts are different from the Sunday afternoon programs.

VCI to Host Preview Of Zionism Exhibit

Volunteers for Clevelanders in Israel will host a special preview of the Diaspora Museum Exhibit, "100 Years of Immigration," to be presented at the Cleveland College of Jewish Studies on Sunday, Nov. 18, at 7:30 p.m. The theme of the exhibit is a century of immigration to Israel from 1882 until the birth of the State of Israel and beyond.

Of special interest to Clevelanders will be a pictorial exhibit of Cleveland's own immigrants to Israel and a short video film of interviews with former Clevelanders attending the dedication of a synagogue in memory of the late community leader, Arthur Jaffe, at Alon Shvut in Israel.

Guest speaker for the event will be Dr. Jerry Mandel, a former Clevelander, who is now chairman of the English Department of Tel Aviv University. Dr. Mandel will describe his own personal experiences as an immigrant to Israel.

Honored guests of the evening will be Neil and Leah Wilkof and their three children, who are immigrating to Israel. Wilkof, a member of the VCI Board of Trustees, has accepted a position with a law firm in Tel Aviv and will be making a new home in that city.
