Yet reaching out I cannot feel.

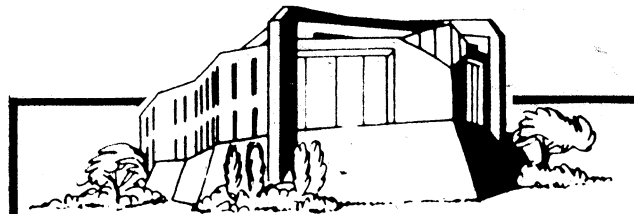
You seem so close—so clearly seen

The Arthur Jaffe Memorial Synagogue

Over a year ago, an outstanding leader of the Cleveland Jewish community, Arthur Jaffe, was cruelly murdered at his place of business by an unknown assailant. In an instant, a precious personality was taken from our midst.

Those who knew Arthur Jaffe do not need to be told what a key role he played in so many ways in his community, nor do they have to be told of the many kindnesses he performed, particularly for those who came as strangers to Cleveland from Israel.

Today, as a living memorial to the memory of this outstanding man, a group of his friends have undertaken to establish as an everlasting memorial to him, the completion of a synagogue in Alon Shvut, located in the Gush Etzion area south of Jerusalem.

This large, magnificent synagogue, overlooking the historic Judean Hills, is to be a center of prayer, learning and community activities. It will be a place of living Judaism.

Arthur Jaffe was a man devoted to Jewish religious life, devoted to the people and the land of Israel. It is indeed a fitting memorial that his name be attached to this synagogue in the beautiful community of Alon Shvut.
